	<i>1 Thessalonians 5:12-18</i>	Live in peace with each other. 14 And we urge you, brothers and sisters, warn those who are idle and disruptive, encourage the disheartened, help the weak, be patient with everyone. 15 Make sure that nobody pays back wrong for wrong, but always strive to do what is good for each other and for everyone else. 16 Rejoice always, 17 pray continually, 18 give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God’s will for you in Christ Jesus.
Authority	<i>Matthew 8:8-10</i>	8 The centurion replied, “Lord, I do not deserve to have you come under my roof. But just say the word, and my servant will be healed. 9 For I myself am a man under authority, with soldiers under me. I tell this one, ‘Go,’ and he goes; and that one, ‘Come,’ and he comes. I say to my servant, ‘Do this,’ and he does it.” 10 When Jesus heard this, he was amazed and said to those following him, “Truly I tell you, I have not found anyone in Israel with such great faith.
	<i>Romans 13:1-7</i>	Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God. 2 Consequently, whoever rebels against the authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and those who do so will bring judgment on themselves. 3 For rulers hold no terror for those who do right, but for those who do wrong. Do you want to be free from fear of the one in authority? Then do what is right and you will be commended. 4 For the one in authority is God’s servant for your good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for rulers do not bear the sword for no reason. They are God’s servants, agents of wrath to bring punishment on the wrongdoer. 5 Therefore, it is necessary to submit to the authorities, not only because of possible punishment but also as a matter of conscience. 6 This is also why you pay taxes, for the authorities are God’s servants, who give their full time to governing. 7 Give to everyone what you owe them: if you owe taxes, pay taxes; if revenue, then revenue; if respect, then respect; if honor, then honor.

	<i>2 Corinthians 13:5-7</i>	Examine yourselves to see whether you are in the faith; test yourselves. Do you not realize that Christ Jesus is in you —unless, of course, you fail the test? 6 And I trust that you will discover that we have not failed the test. 7 Now we pray to God that you will not do anything wrong—not so that people will see that we have stood the test but so that you will do what is right even though we may seem to have failed.

Guilt	<i>Gen 2:25</i>	Adam and his wife were both naked, and they felt no shame.
	<i>Genesis 3:10</i>	He answered, “I heard you in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid.”
	<i>Psalms 32:5</i>	Then I acknowledged my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity. I said, “I will confess my transgressions to the Lord.”And you forgave the guilt of my sin.
	<i>Psalms 38:4</i>	My guilt has overwhelmed me like a burden too heavy to bear.
Forgiveness	<i>Matthew 6:12</i>	And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.

	<i>1 John 1:9</i>	If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.
	<i>John 1:12</i>	Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God
Holy Spirit	<i>John 14:16-17</i>	And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever— 17 the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be[a] in you

Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you. 7 And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words. 8 Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him. 9 "This, then, is how you should pray:"Our Father in heaven,hallowed be your name,10 your kingdom come,your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.11 Give us today our daily bread. 12 And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. 13 And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.

	<i>1 John 4:19-21</i>	19 We love because he first loved us. 20 Whoever claims to love God yet hates a brother or sister is a liar. Suffering	<p><i>Romans 5:3-5</i></p> <p><i>2 Corinthians 1:3-11</i></p> <p><i>1 Peter 3:14-17</i></p>	<p>Not only so, but we[a] also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; 4 perseverance, character; and character, hope. 5 And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.</p> <p>Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, 4 who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God. 5 For just as we share abundantly in the sufferings of Christ, so also our comfort abounds through Christ. 6 If we are distressed, it is for your comfort and salvation; if we are comforted, it is for your comfort, which produces in you patient endurance of the same sufferings we suffer. 7 And our hope for you is firm, because we know that just as you share in our sufferings, so also you share in our comfort.</p> <p>8 We do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters,[a] about the troubles we experienced in the province of Asia. 	<i>James 4:7</i>	Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.
Anger	<i>Proverbs 12:16</i>	Fools show their annoyance at once, but the prudent overlook an insult.
	<i>Proverbs 14:29</i>	Whoever is patient has great understanding, but one who is quick-tempered displays folly.
	<i>Ephesians 4:26-27</i>	"In your anger do not sin"[a]: Do not let the sun go down while you are still angry, 27 and do not give the devil a foothold.
	<i>Ephesians 4:31</i>	Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice.
